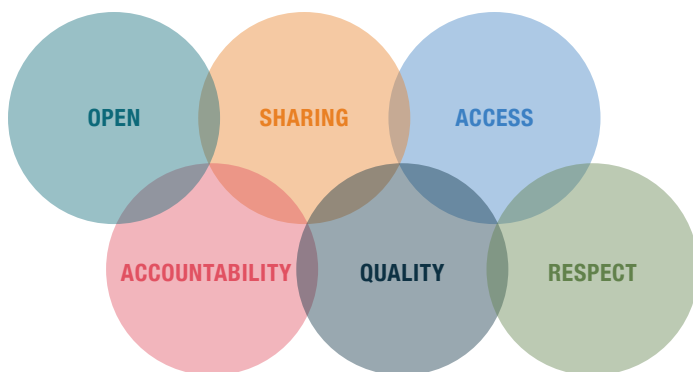
Purpose

We lead the development, use, growth and sustainability of open education resources and practices in BC for post-secondary education and partners.

The 5Rs of Open

- 1. Retain** – the right to make, own, and control copies of the content
- 2. Reuse** – the right to reuse the content verbatim or in its unaltered form
- 3. Revise** – the right to adapt the content itself
- 4. Remix** – the right to combine the original or revised content with other content to create something new
- 5. Redistribute** – the right to make and share copies of the original content, your revisions, or your remixes with others

- Continue to position B.C. as a leader in open educational practice, both nationally and internationally

Recent research demonstrates that over half of B.C. students (54%) do not purchase the required textbook and 26% choose not to register for a course because of textbook costs. If students cannot afford their course materials, their success is at risk.

Spending Costs

In a 2016 survey of about 1500 students from the University of British Columbia, nearly half of respondents (49%) said they spend at least \$500 on textbooks each year, and the mean reported cost per year for textbooks was \$620 (So & Doering, 2016).

B.C. Open Textbook Collection

A Zed Cred/Z-Degree is a set of courses in a specific program area that allows a student to earn a credential, such as an associate degree or certificate program, with zero textbook costs by using open educational resources and/or free library materials.
